# Error Message When You Create or Edit a Schema in a REST Consumer

## Description

When you create or edit a schema in a REST Consumer Activity, you receive the following error message.

"...RadAsyncUpload could not create App Data folder..."

#### Cause

Cora SeQuence users or services do not have sufficient permission to create folders or files to the <code>App\_Data</code> main folder.

### **Affected Versions**

8.3 and later.

## Solution

1. Grant full permissions to the <code>iis\_users</code> group contained in the application pool user to the folder in the following path.

C:\inetpub\wwwroot\[administration site folder name]\Administration\

2. Add the following folders to  $C:\inetpub\wwwroot\[administration\]$  is the folder name  $Administration\]$ .

- O App Data
- O App\_Data\RadUploadTemp
